Back Ground:

Addiction is a global issue that affects millions of people in both developed and underdeveloped countries. Illicit drug abuse destroys lives and careers in various ways. Drug prevention efforts should include early intervention with vulnerable groups, targeted education, and drug-free activities for young people.

June 26th is celebrated as the "International Day against Drugs and Illicit Trafficking" worldwide. Established by the United Nations General Assembly in 1987, this day serves as a strong reminder of the goals agreed upon by the member states for developing an international society free of drug abuse and exploitation. According to the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), in 2012, between 162 - 324 million people aged 15 to 64 used illicit substances at least once. It is reported that 10% to 14% of those who use psychoactive substances will develop substance use problems. A National Survey on Drugs conducted in 2012 and published in 2013 by UNODC and the Ministry of Narcotics Control, Government of Pakistan, revealed that about 6.7 million people in Pakistan are using drugs, excluding alcohol. Unfortunately, the problem of drug addiction is increasing at the grassroots level, affecting young people throughout the country.

The Drug Advisory Training Hub (DATH), a project of Youth Council for Anti Narcotics (YOCFAN) is organizing various activities such as a media campaign against drugs, a special prize distribution ceremony, and the display of flexes and posters with slogans on the occasion of the International Day on 26th June. These events are being held in collaboration with different government and private sectors. It is expected that about 5 million people will be reached with the message against drug use through these activities, with participation from youth, students, teachers, senior citizens, women, social workers, doctors, and journalists. The primary objective of substance use prevention is to help people, especially young people, avoid or delay the initiation of using psychoactive substances. The broader aim of substance use prevention is to promote the healthy and safe development of children and youth, enabling them to realize their potential and become contributing members of their community.

To create awareness among youth especially college students through education, lectures programs etc.

To provide basic information through awareness against use of narcotics.

To build a better image of Pakistan through different activities.

After the recitation of the Holy Quran Ms. Tabinda introduced guest speakers and highlighted DATH & YOCFAN activities regarding International Day. She said that our aim is to fight against the use of drugs and coordinate all government and nongovernmental departments on drug demand reduction. She thanked all members of the organization especially Syed Mohsin commitment, dedication, and best work he has done against drugs in the community and also thanked all stakeholders in Green International University, Lahore.

Syed Zulfiqar Hussain thanked all the guests who joined the event regarding International Day against Drug Abuse. He said that Drug Advisory Training Hub (DATH) is a unique and model project about drug demand reduction activities between the Youth Council for Anti Narcotics (YOCFAN) and DC Office Lahore. The main theme of this project is to organize training, counseling sessions for affected people and their families, launch awareness programs against sheesha cafes, vaping, velo and provide treatment free of cost to Substance Use Disorder (SUD). This year's theme is Evidence is clear invest in prevention. He said that Pakistan is an underdeveloped country with limited resources. Due to ignorance of its hidden hazards, the drug abuse problem is widespread and becoming serious. It is humanly impossible for one person or organization to tackle this problem on its own. Most of people in Pakistan believe that some people are drug addicts and only a limited number of young persons are involved in it and it is not an alarming situation.

He further said that if we look UNODC and the Ministry of Narcotics Control National Survey on Drug Use 2013, the report reveals a substantial proportion of Pakistan's population aged 15 to 64 suffers from devastating consequences of substance abuse. The report estimates that six percent or 6.7 million people in Pakistan used drugs in previous years. Cannabis was found to be the most commonly used drug in Pakistan, with 3.6 percent of the adult population, or four million people,

listed as users' opiate, namely opium, and heroin, which are used by almost one percent of overall drug users, he added. Mr. Hussain said that Lahore is a metropolitan city and total population has reached nearly 130 million. About 5 lack people are using hard and soft drugs in the city.

Syed Farhad Ali Shah, Prosecutor General Punjab said that the government already working on different interventions against drugs because a big number of our youth across the country using all kinds of drugs. We think that why our students use drugs, parents are the main frontline to provide best counseling technique and talk. Parents is big stakeholders but have limited time for their children's. Being as a father or head of family we have lot of responsibilities to address different issues with kids friendly atmosphere. He said the role of law enforcement agencies is very important to control drug trafficking, processing, and abuse or distribution in the country. The performance of law enforcement agencies is not hundred percent positive but some agencies are working actively to control and stop narcotics inside and outside the country.

Dr. Syed Amir Gilani, Rector said that the university introduced different interventions with the help of DATH & YOCFAN against drugs. Parenting, teaching, and nonteaching sessions are organized in the university. We have a clear vision, no compromise will be made on drug trafficking and the use of drugs in the university. He appreciated Syed Zulfiqar Hussain, Syed Mohsin, and their entire team who did a lot in the field of drug demand reduction.
